PRIMARY SCHOOL CHILDREN PLANT SUNFLOWERS FOR **UKRAINE**

40 pupils from Falkland Primary School were joined by the Mayor of Newbury and Newbury in Bloom volunteers on Friday 25 May to plant sunflowers in support of the people of Ukraine.

180 sunflower seeds were planted in a new bed at Greenham House Gardens, with school staff and members of the Newbury Town Council Green Spaces Working Group lending a hand with the work. Comments amongst the children included, "it was the best morning ever" and "it was the most fun I've had in a long time!".

The sunflower is the national flower of Ukraine, and it is hoped that they will grow into a symbol of solidarity and support for the local Ukrainian community.

Mayor of Newbury Cllr Nigel Foot said, "The children seemed to have lots of fun planting the seeds and are excited about watching them bloom later in the year. The flowers will make for a beautiful display throughout the summer, whilst holding a deeper significance for those displaced to Newbury by the war."

The Newbury Pride Parade 2023 took place on Saturday 24 June kicking off at Victoria Park at 1pm and heading through Parkway Shopping to the Market Place. Newbury Town Council were pleased to support this event which was a great success.

Newbury Market was trading as usual in the Market Place alongside the festival and the Town Hall flew the Pride flag during the celebrations. Newbury Pride is run by a dedicated group of volunteer committee members, and everyone is welcome to join in the Parade and celebrate alongside members of the LGBT+ community.
