The Council noted that the construction of the Community Café required alterations to the Council's lease of Victoria Park from West Berkshire District Council (a 99 year lease until 2103). The District Council has agreed to enable this by way of a licence granted under the lease.

On the 6<sup>th</sup> January I was invited to the Base in Greenham to open an art exhibition, entitled Decoding Braille, Decoding Me. I would encourage all Councillors to visit the Base.

On the 12<sup>th</sup> January I had an interesting morning visiting the West Berkshire Therapy Centre in Thatcham. They help people who have had a stroke, heart attack or any serious operation get fit again at minimum cost to the client.

On Thursday morning on the 20<sup>th</sup> January I was invited to unveil the Blue Plaque of Ms Jane Luker. In 1910 the Female-only Newbury County School moved to the Luker site on the Andover Rd. Miss Luker was a formable leader of her day and was well ahead in Woman's Liberation.

On the 26<sup>th</sup> January I presented 30 training certificates at the Newbury Resources Centre and was also given a tour of all the excellent work that they do in our community.

On the 3<sup>rd</sup> of February I hosted a visit to the Town Hall from Beenham Primary School and gave them a talk on my role as Mayor and a tour of this historic building.

19<sup>TH</sup> February I was invited to an afternoon crafting by the Newbury Crafters Group and had a great time with the ladies and one gentleman.

I was invited to speak at the Donnington Valley Hotel, to the Newbury Rotary Club. I gave them a talk on the history of the role as Mayor.

On the 27<sup>th</sup> February attended a Memorial Service to remember all the service men who perished on the HMS Tigris. Brave young men who died for us. We Will Remember Them.

# A) Staff Matters

 The Town Hall Officer: Congratulations to Brendon Ferreira, who has successfully completed his probation period and is now a permanent member of the Staff team.



- The Community Services Manager: for personal reasons, David Ingram has reduced his working days to 3 days per week minimum, with effect from 9 May 2022. David will concentrate on the council's major projects, such as the construction of the Community Café in Victoria Park, the Council's new grounds maintenance contract, the new roof for the bandstand in Victoria Park, the playgrounds investments and the refurbishment of the public toilets at The Wharf.
- We are recruiting: Mrs. Kym Heasman will shortly be going on maternity leave and we all wish the very best for Kym and James when their new baby arrives. We are recruiting for maternity cover, 3 days per week.
- **Staff Structure Review:** The Staff Subcommittee has approved a proposal to carry out a review to look at the staff structure needed to effectively deliver the Council's Strategy. The review will also have regard to business continuity and opportunities for progression within the structure.
- Hybrid Working Arrangements: From 6 June staff will be operating a rota based on minimum attendance of 60% at the Town Hall (currently 40%). This is to address some of the reductions mentioned above and also to avoid "Lone Working" situations in the Town Hall. Pre-pandemic public opening hours will also operate from that date.



• We have successfully trialled technology known as "Meeting Owl" ( see picture to the left) which enables hybrid meetings. Agendas for Council and committee meetings will now include a Zoom link and it is now possible for members of the public and the Council to join our meetings on Zoom. The Owl provides reasonable quality at a very cost-effective price.

# **B) Community Services:**

The Community Services Team continue to deliver excellent services for the people of Newbury:

- As reported by the Mayor, we recently opened the adventure Golf facility in Victoria Park, which is a popular addition to the attractions we already have in the Park.
- The Splash park will re-open in mid-May and this is always enjoyed by the younger visitors to the Park.
- We have just completed a Service level Agreement for the provision of firstclass tennis and coaching at the courts in Victoria Park. The Agreement is a partnership between The Council, the tennis clubs in Newbury and Thatcham, the National Tennis Association and the Lawn Tennis Association. We are the first local authority in the country to be partners in an agreement of this nature and it offers very exciting opportunities for all interested in tennis in our area.
- The Family day is back in Victoria Park, after a forced absence of 2 years. This
  year's event takes place on Sunday 12 June, with fun for all ages. (Volunteers to
  help on the day would be very welcome! Please contact Caroline if you are
  available.
- The CS Team has launched this year's In Bloom campaign, with awards available in seven categories:
  - Neighbourhood 5 + properties (including alms-houses & canal boats)
  - Community Projects any community or Group working together.
  - Places of worship or Assembly
  - Allotment
  - Miniature Garden (window box, hanging basket 1m x 1m max)
  - Business
  - Schools

# Eight Bells for Mental Health About Us

Eight Bells is a friendly, member-led, voluntary group, that provides friendship, support, and a listening ear to people experiencing mental health issues in Newbury, Thatcham, and surrounding areas.

We provide support for up to 400 people living across West Berkshire whose lives are affected by mental health issues. We offer a safe, supportive and welcoming environment at our Drop-In Centre which is based close to Newbury Town Centre. Our friendly social sessions are open every Monday, Thursday, and Friday from 9 am to 5 pm and include activities such as Yoga, Meditation, Art Therapy, and Nature.

Members are provided with a hot lunch every Monday, enjoy a variety of day trips out, and have a beautiful garden area to enjoy. High-speed broadband and laptops are available for members to use.

The charity work tirelessly to help members improve their lives, wellbeing, confidence, and self-esteem through volunteering and training opportunities, access to projects, a range of activities, and peer support from a dedicated team of volunteers.

We help service users overcome stigma, prejudice, discrimination, and isolation so they can enjoy a quality of life others take for granted. We offer advice on a range of issues such as finance, housing, benefits, and employment and are able to refer members for specialist counseling and support if their mental health deteriorates.

We are a uniquely members-led organisation where service users have a hand and say in the way our charity runs and elect their own management committee at an annual AGM.

Our longest-serving members offer basic mentoring and a one-to-one friendship scheme to new and more vulnerable service users which has been hugely successful. We also work alongside several other local charities and community groups, including Recovery in Mind, Loose Ends, West Berkshire Homeless, and Newbury Soup Kitchen Eight Bells receives a number of referrals from GPs, the Community Mental Health Team, West Berkshire Social Services, and other health professionals and organisations as well as private families and individuals.

A referral is not required though, members who would like to join are asked to fill in a confidential membership form.

Newbury Speakability

#### Welcome

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People with Aphasia from Newbury, West Berkshire and surrounding areas are welcome in our group. We will help you to build your confidence, develop new skills, make new friends and practice speaking. We also have Speech Therapy.

Aphasia affects people in different ways. Many of our group have difficulties with speaking, understanding speech, reading, writing, numbers, dealing with money and telling the time. It doesn't affect their intelligence. They think in the same way as everyone else but are unable to communicate their thoughts easily.

We meet on the **first and third Mendays** of the menth at the Chequers Hetel in Newbury at 18:38 am.

We meet on the second and fourth Mondays of the month on Zoom at 10:00 am.

Speech Therapy is available every week.


