There were also awards for Newbury's allotment tenants, following allotment visits at Newbury's six allotment sites by Councillors earlier in the year.

Awards were presented to tenants who were judged to have kept the best allotment plots on each site. Awards included 'Best Newcomer', 'Best Plots', 'Best Schools

Plot' and 'Best Site Overall'.

The plots were judged on a number of different criteria which included the overall visual impact, effective use of plot, produce variation, pathway condition and any special provisions for wildlife. A trophy was presented to Dave Cole, Steward at our One Tree Park Allotment Site, as they were judged to be the best site overall. An award was also given to Falkland Primary School who tend an allotment plot at Wash Common.
